We took inspiration for this font from the art deco movement that began in the 1920's, most notably in Havana, Cuba.


This custom san serif subtlety captures the architectural similarities between the art deco movement of Cuba and the traditional styles of design found in China.

MENU DESIGN

The wooden menu board in addition to the selected paper are meant to pay homage to the latticed windows and dividers found within traditional Chinese homes.

The laser etched pattern draws influence from the sharp angles found in both Chinese and art deco design, and the metal hardware is a nod to the building materials used in the 1920's.

Pastel colors, scalloped edges and tropical patterning capture the vibrancy of Havana's color palette.
